



PROCESS DESCRIPTION AND LOG

PURPOSE OF THE LEADERSHIP COACH CERTIFICATION:

1. Celebrate completion of 60 hours of practice- and assessment-based professional training in leadership coaching.
2. Provide rigorous training and structured support for learning and practice, in alignment with the International Coach Federation (ICF) core coaching competencies.
3. Support adaptive approaches to leadership with individuals and teams.
4. Set standards of excellence to protect and serve consumers of leadership coaching services.

PROCESS COMPONENTS:

- ↓ Celebrate completion of 60 hours of practice- and assessment-based professional training in leadership coaching.
- ↓ High level of understanding of leadership principles and competencies (pre-requisite).
- ↓ Training and practice in leadership coaching competencies – in the classroom, online practice labs, and in the field – with feedback from KLC’s Professional (PCC) and Master Certified (MCC) Coaches.
- ↓ Written knowledge assessment.
- ↓ Assessment of your (recorded) coaching by a PCC or MCC coach.
- ↓ **Submit this log and achieve Kansas Leadership Center Level 2 Certificate – Coach.**
- ↓ Log 10 additional hours of ICF-approved mentor coaching – to hone your coaching skills.
- ↓ Log required coaching hours to qualify to apply for ICF’s Associate Certified Coach (ACC) credential.
- ↓ Pass ICF exams and achieve ACC credential
- ↓ Continue to work toward your PCC with KLC’s virtual Advanced Coach Training.

Reviewer will also be asked to indicate applicant's level of proficiency with integrating the KLC Framework into the coaching session. KLC will provide a list of approved reviewers.
