



PROCESS DESCRIPTION AND LOG

PURPOSE OF THE LEADERSHIP COACH INTENSIVE:

1. Provide rigorous training and structured support for learning and practice, in alignment with the International Coach Federation (ICF) core coaching competencies.
2. Support adaptive approaches to leadership with individuals and teams.
3. Set standards of excellence to protect and serve consumers of leadership coaching services.

PROCESS COMPONENTS:

1. High level of understanding of adaptive leadership principles and competencies (pre-requisite).
2. Completion of 60 hours of professional training and practice in leadership coaching competencies – in the classroom, online practice labs, and in the field – with feedback from KLC’s Professional (PCC) and Master Certified (MCC) Coaches.
3. Completion of written knowledge assessment.
4. Assessment of your (recorded) coaching by a PCC or MCC coach. \$250 additional cost paid to mentor coach.
5. **Submit recording, transcript, written review, and log, to achieve Kansas Leadership Center Certificate of Completion – Leadership Coach.**

TO CONTINUE TOWARDS THE INTERNATIONAL COACH FEDERATION’S (ICF) ASSOCIATE CERTIFIED COACH (ACC) CREDENTIAL:

1. Log 10 hours of ICF-approved mentor coaching to hone your coaching skills.
2. Log required 100 hours (75 paid) of coaching experience.
3. Submit recording and transcript of live coaching session.
4. Pass ICF Coach Knowledge Assessment (CKA) and achieve ACC credential.
5. Continue to work toward your PCC with KLC’s virtual Advanced Coach Training.
